Orientation and Mobility Words for the week:

Landmark – something distinct and permanent that is always in the same location making it a reliable point of reference.

Clue – something that is usually present such as a sound or a smell that provides a hint to where one is. Clues are helpful but not always reliable as is a landmark.

Tip for the Week: Encourage and help your child to recognize and use **landmarks** and **clues** for way finding.

Melanie Thompson began working with students with disabilities at thirteen years old through a summer camp for students with disabilities and at-risk youth. She has been on committees such as transition, media, Work Base Learning, Project Based Learning, and a senior class advisor.

What she enjoys most about her job is seeing her students grow in maturity, independence, confidence, and skill from year to year. She takes great pride in their accomplishments and enjoys sharing her love for learning new things and experiences with her students. When she is not at GAB she enjoys kayaking, traveling the country for good BBQ, singing in her church choir, and spending time with her husband and two children.


